Check In

SafeZone users can choose to check in on the SafeZone App or PC desktop for the following scenarios (but not limited to):

- Lone workers/after-hours workers, individuals who may feel vulnerable
- Workers in high-risk areas such as working in high-risk chemical labs



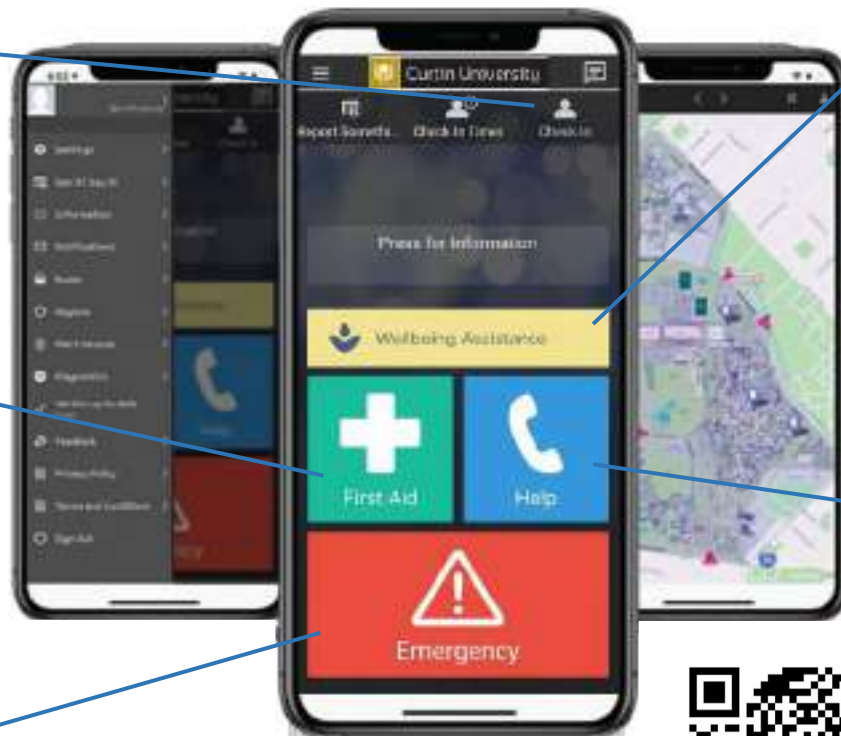
First Aid

Emergency

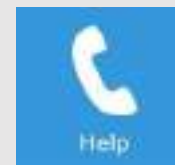
If the user is in a vulnerable or unsafe situation. Alerts all patrol officers and the Control Centre.

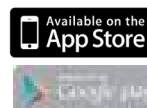

SafeZone Adding Medical Information



HOW TO: Add medical information to your SafeZone profile

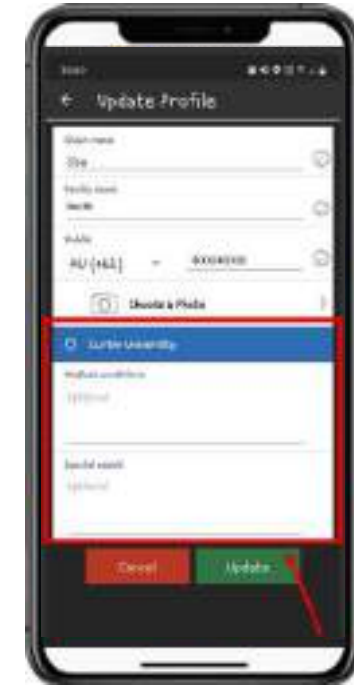
1. Open the SafeZone app.
Click the Settings button (three lines in top left-hand corner).



2. Click on your profile.



3. Enter any specific medical conditions or special needs to your profile.
Add a photo.



This information will be used by the Safer Community Team to provide support.

Please note that Curtin Emergency Procedures will be followed in any emergencies. If a First Aid Officer is called, they can only provide basic first aid. An ambulance will be called if determined to be necessary



Personal Safety Advice

Secure Your Space.

- Lock doors and windows.
- Do not leave items outside of your accommodation
- such as parcels or an e-ridable, even if it's a balcony.

Share Your Whereabouts.

- Let someone you trust know your daily schedule, especially if you're going out late or visiting off-campus locations.

Stay Visible and Alert.

- Avoid walking alone at night,
- Stick to well-lit paths and main routes.
- Remain fully aware of your surroundings.
- Contact the Safer Community team to enquire about an escort from campus to student housing.

Trust Your Instincts and Be Prepared.

- If something feels off, remove yourself from the situation immediately.
- Keep a personal safety device on hand, such as a whistle, mobile phone with SafeZone or a personal alarm.

Know Emergency Contacts.

- Keep a list of key contacts handy;
 - Safer Community team.
 - WASM security.
 - Police.
 - Trusted neighbours or friends.
- Make sure your phone is charged and accessible.

Be mindful of what you post online.

- Even if your profile is private, consider whether you'd be comfortable sharing the same information with someone sitting next to you — such as announcing you're on holiday and your house is unattended.



Who to call & when.

Life-Threatening Emergency Call 000

- Someone's life is in immediate danger
- There is a fire, explosion, or serious accident.
- Witnessing an ongoing violent crime
- Urgent need for ambulance, fire, or police attendance.

Report to Crime Stoppers 1800 333 000 or online

For sharing information that might help police with investigations.

- You have information about a crime that has happened, but you are not in danger.
- You want to remain anonymous.
- You have tips about drug dealing, stolen property, or suspicious activity.

Police Assistance Line (Non-Emergencies) Call 131 444

- Property damage, theft, or break-in that has already happened and the offender is no longer present.
- Reporting suspicious behaviour at the time.

Quick Escalation Guide

Immediate danger / life at risk → 000

Police needed, but not urgent → 131 444

General crime info / anonymous tip → Crime Stoppers (1800 333 000)

On-campus safety concern or if any of the above have been contacted first. → Safer Community Team (9266 4444 or via Safe zone)

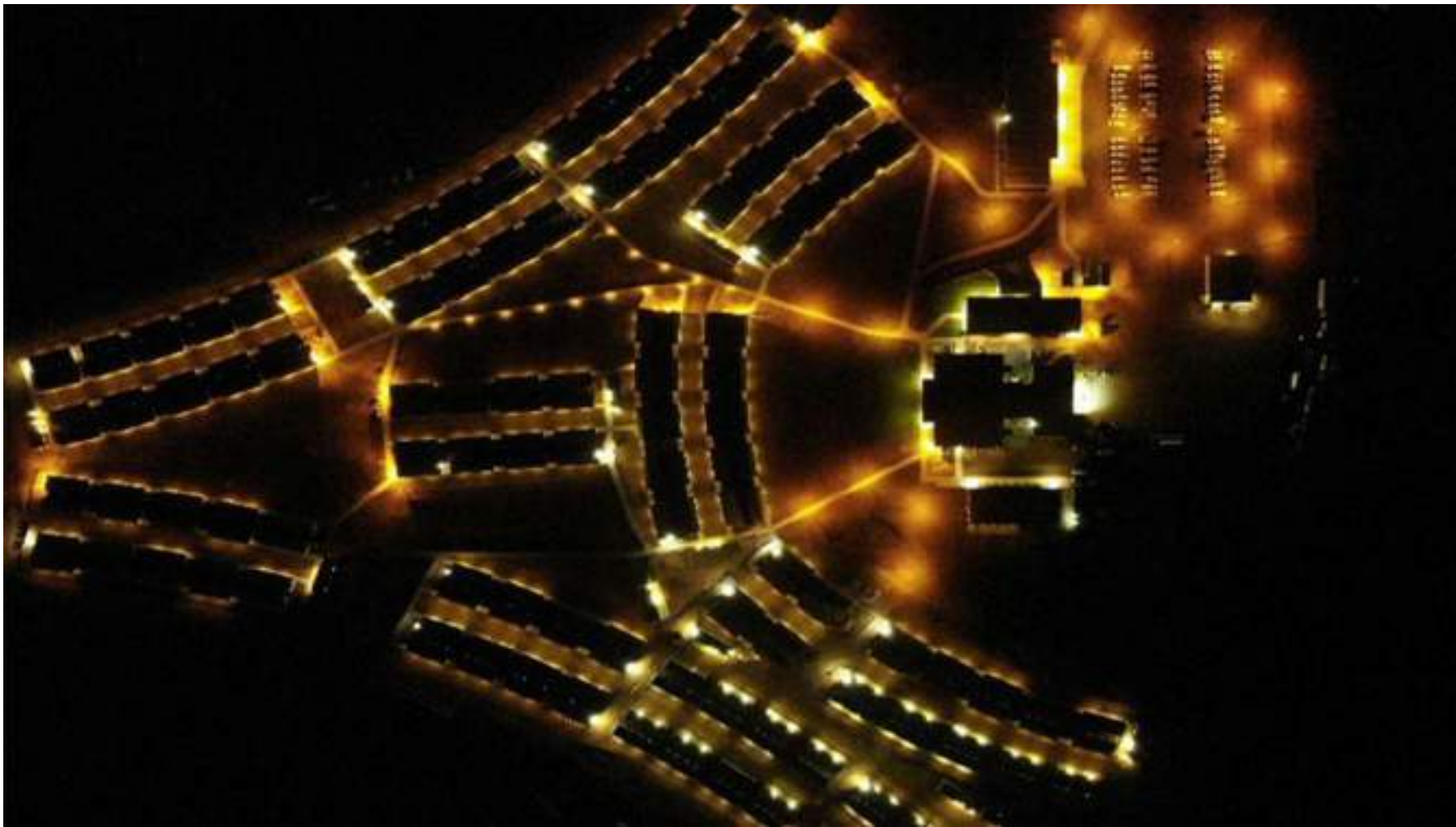

Course overview

Mining engineers are responsible for the **planning, design, and operation of a mine.**

Management of underground mines is restricted to **mining engineering graduates.**

These courses provide a comprehensive knowledge in a broad range of science and technology, including **geology, surveying, electrical, civil and mechanical engineering, computing and environmental science, health and safety, ventilation, and management.**

Theoretical and practical principles of mining engineering including the **concept of smart mining using advanced data analytics and robotics applications** in the mining industry.



Duration and availability

There are two intakes each year, one in **February** and another in **July**.

The **initial two years** of this major are conducted exclusively at the **Bentley** campus.

The **final two years** are offered solely at the **Kalgoorlie campus**.

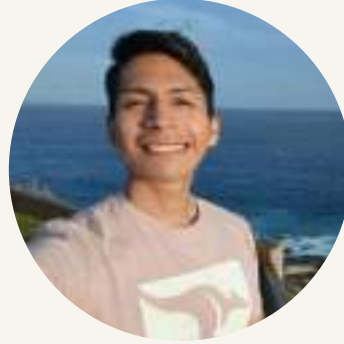

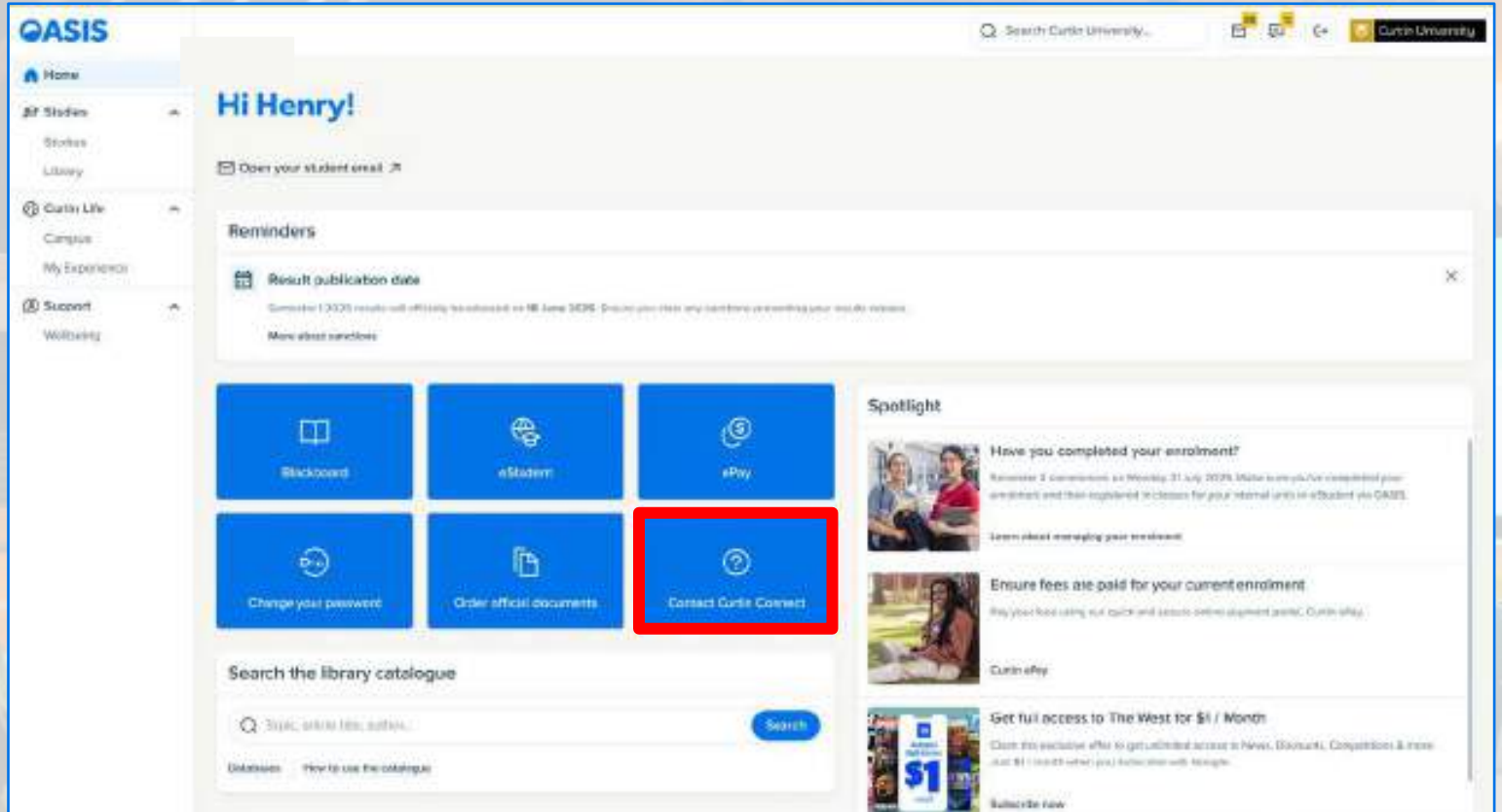

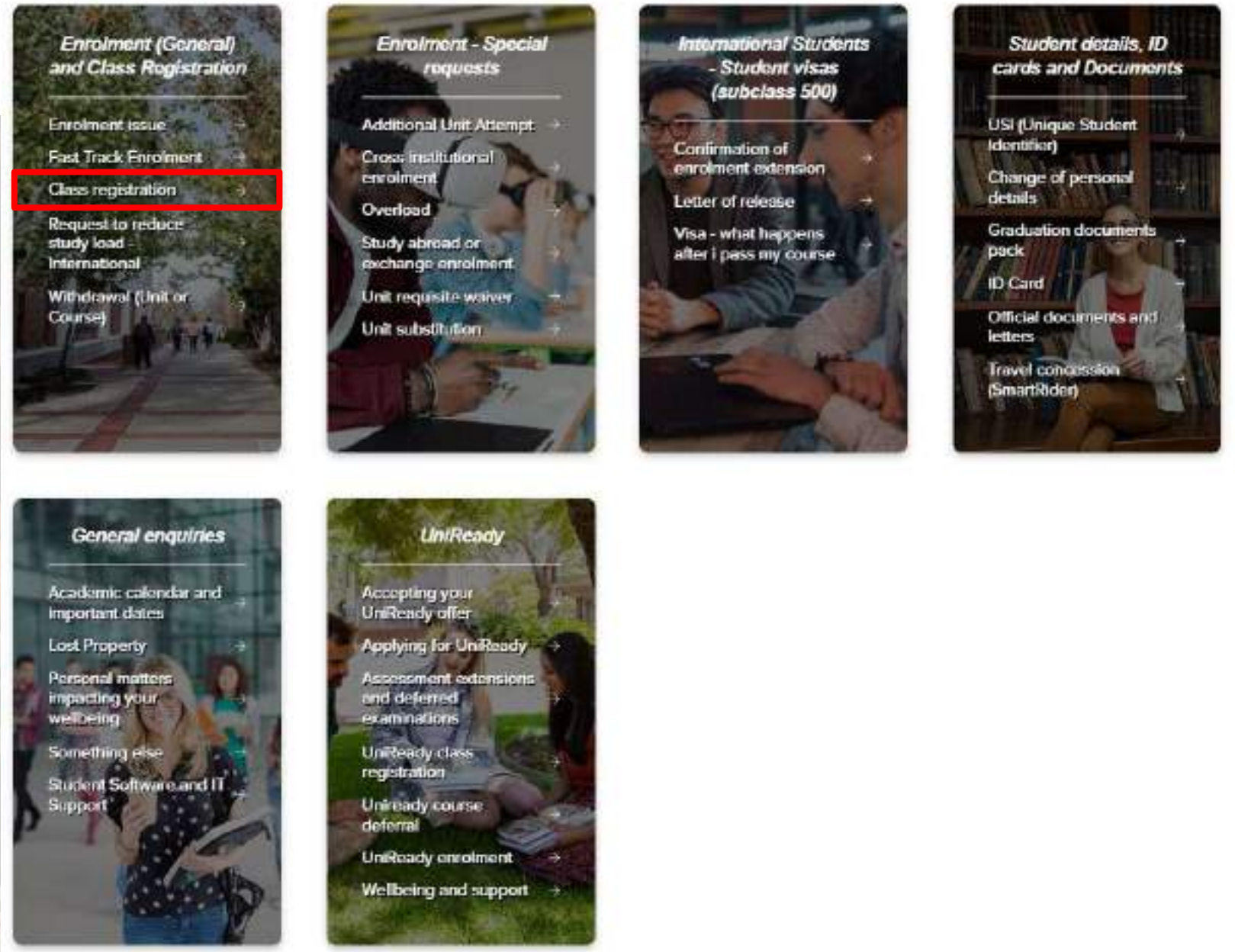

How do I overload my unit enrolment in a study period?

Overloading refers to enrolling in more than the standard study load for any given study period. For example, undertaking 125 credits (five 25-credit units) within a semester instead of the standard 100 credits (four 25-credit units).

Overload requests are assessed on a case-by-case basis, and are subject to the final approval of the course coordinator but in general, applicants:

- must have a high course-weighted average
- must have passed all their units in the previous study period
- cannot have any outstanding or unfinished unit results
- must already be enrolled full time for the study period in which the application is for.

To apply to overload, you will need to submit your request through [Curtin's online web form](#). Select **Enrolment-Special requests** then **Overload**, then **Submit Enquiry**. In your application, be sure to include the study period you are wanting to overload in, the unit details (just code and title), and provide the reasoning for your request.

Overload requests must be submitted at least one week before the study period begins. If requests are submitted after the study period has begun, we cannot guarantee they will be actioned in time for the current study period.

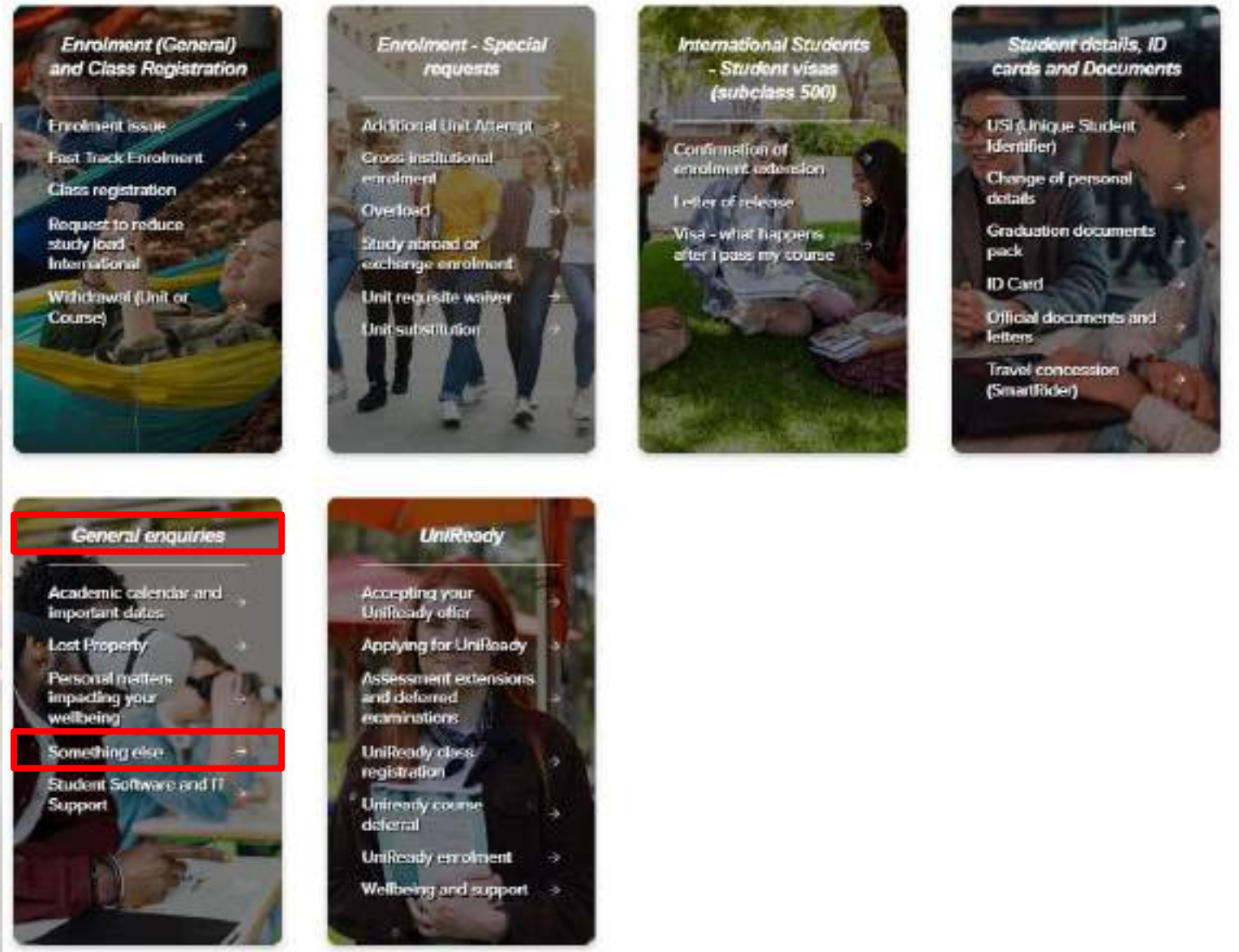

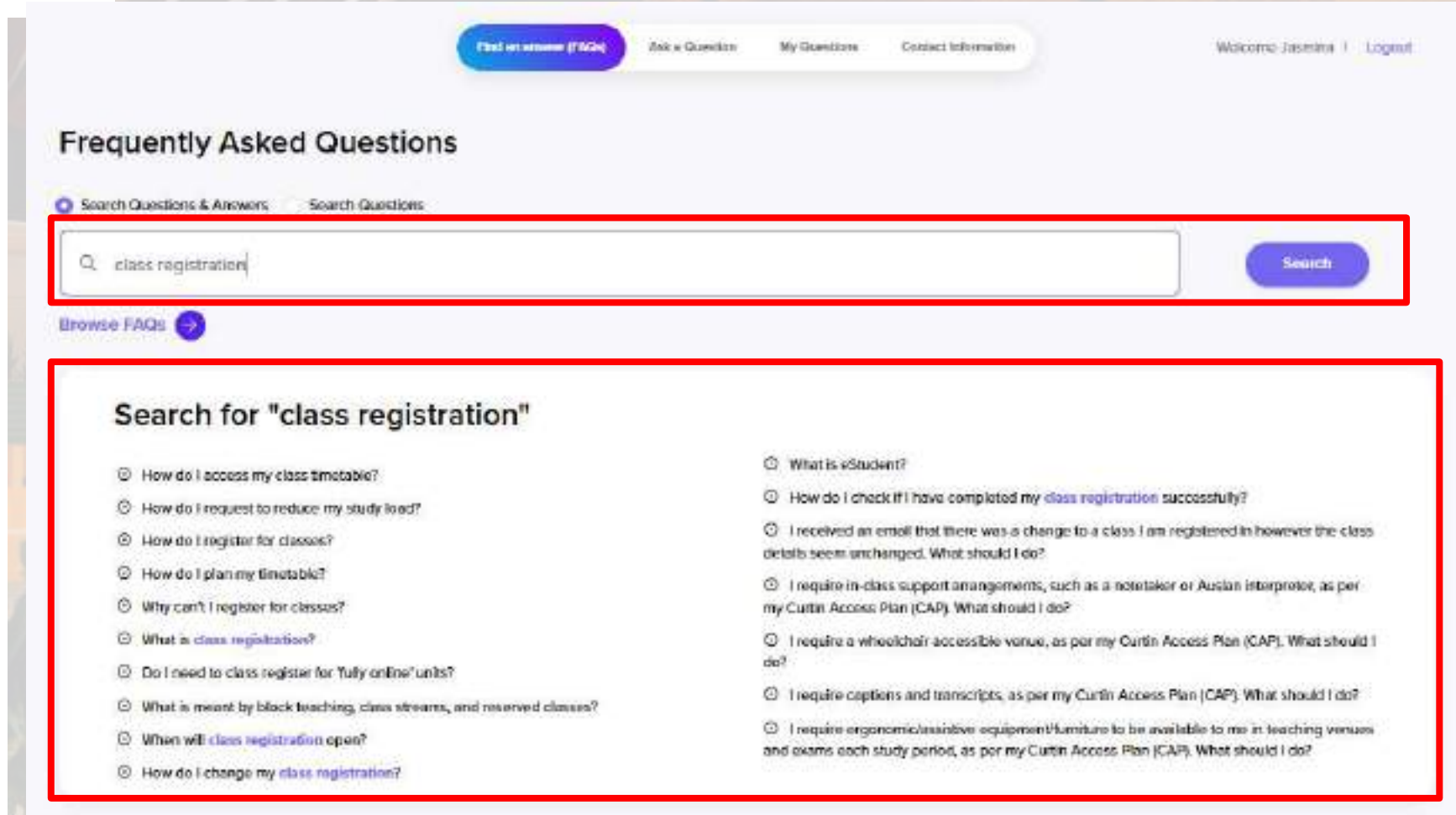

Please try the options below to resolve your timetable clash:

- Ensure that you are enrolled correctly by following the course structure on the Course Handbook. First, it is recommended to amend your enrolment to align with the advised course structure.
- Check that there are no alternative times available for the clashing units.
- If one of the clashing units is an optional/elective unit, you may need to choose an alternative optional/elective unit.
- If an online option for the unit is available and you are not bound by enrolment conditions (e.g. student visa enrolment conditions), you can choose to study the unit online.
- If your clash is between a lecture and another class activity, you may choose not to register for the lecture and instead watch the recording via Elluminate, as long as recordings are available and there are no attendance requirements, assessments or other compulsory activities scheduled during the lecture time; you may need to wait until the unit outline is published in QASIS (approximately one week before teaching starts) to confirm.
- If your clash is between two core units, you may wish to select another unit that is available to you on your study plan.

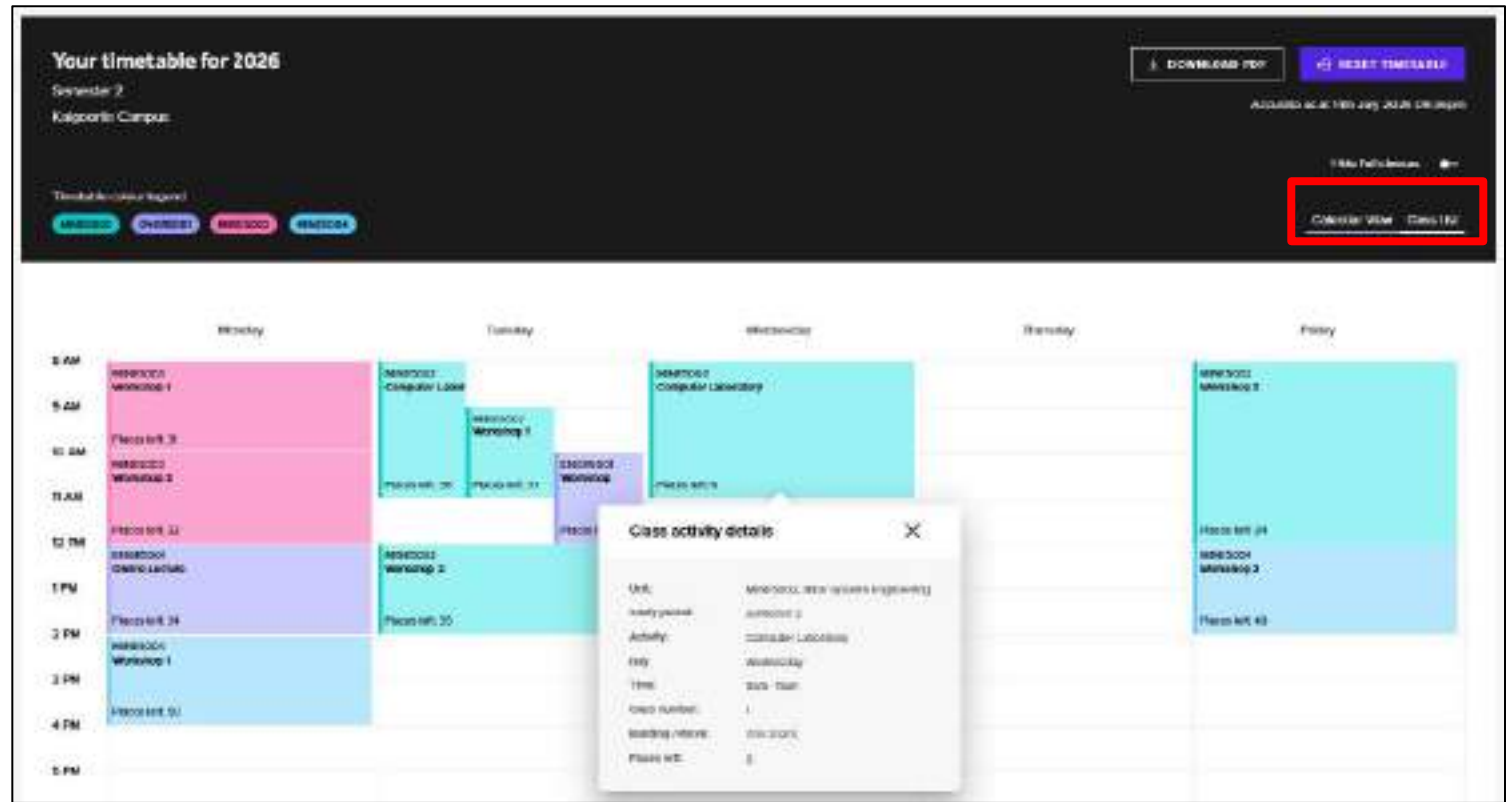

International Student Advice

An Australian student visa allows you to come to Australia for a specified period to study at an Australian educational institution.

Your student visa will allow you to:

- Undertake full-time study in Australia (100 credits per semester at Curtin).
- Stay in and re-enter Australia for the duration of your course.
- Work up to 48 hours per fortnight during semester and unlimited hours during semester breaks.



There are **strict conditions attached to your student visas**, which you need to understand and comply with. Some of the conditions include:

- Maintaining a full-time study load. For Curtin University students a full time load is 100 credits per semester.
- Making satisfactory academic progress.
- Completing your studies within the timeframe outlined on your eCoE.
- Working no more than 48 hours per fortnight during any study period. *
- Notifying the University of your 'contact' address and phone number within seven days of your arrival and if you change your address later.
- Holding Overseas Student Health Cover from an Australian Government-approved provider for the duration of your visa.
- You are required to enrol in face-to-face internal study. *

Student Visa Conditions



International Student Visa Conditions

- Subclass 500 (Student) visa holders are expected to study face-to-face (internal mode).
- The Department of Home Affairs allows up to one-third of a course to be completed online or externally, but this is not a student choice.
- This allowance exists to support Universities when units must be delivered online due to academic, operational or regulatory reasons.
- Students who choose online units themselves may risk breaching visa conditions.
- This risk increases if the University later delivers multiple units online (e.g. in final year), potentially exceeding the one-third limit.
- Curtin University does not encourage or support planned online study for Subclass 500 visa holders unless the University determines the delivery mode.
- Students are responsible for ensuring their enrolment complies with all visa conditions.



Important Information

- If you are unsure about study plans, especially regarding transferring to Kalgoorlie from Bently Perth Campus, please contact your relevant major coordinators.
- FIFO students - please inform your Unit Coordinators ahead of semester start, to ensure possible adjustments to assessment. (Do not wait until assessments are due)
- Please ensure you have the correct documentation when applying for an assessment extension. Do not appeal unless you have done everything right. You can contact Curtin Connect for assistance.
