MASTER OF COMMERCE SEMESTER 2, 2026

Congratulations on starting your Master of Commerce! This handy guide will step you through the enrolment and major selection process for your degree and address some queries you may have at this stage of your journey. The structure of your degree

The Master of Commerce is made up of 16 units, which if studied full-time will take 2 years. A full-time student can study 4 units per semester. Each unit is worth 25 credits points, so in total you have a total of 400 credit points to complete.

In your first semester, you will study commerce units that will enhance your employability, including business project management, business analytics and data visualisation, and transformative technologies that impact society and its business practices. These core units will extend your knowledge in areas of business and STEM, and enable you to network with a wider range of peers. Your alternative core units selection will be based on your major, please refer to Page 3. And in your second semester, you will study the 4th core unit business research methods.

You'll also engage in practical learning experiences that will sharpen your ability to solve complex business challenges, and acquire valuable research skills that you can apply to your chosen industry. Your studies also include the following transformative experience and capstone units:

- **Corporate Sustainability Immersion:** This is a work-integrated learning experience, in which you'll participate in an industry-connected business innovation project centred on sustainable development and social impact.
- **Wicked Problems:** In this unit you'll explore multifaceted real-world challenges that have global, community and individual repercussions.
- **Executive Education:** Choose five one-day masterclasses (or equivalent) that serve as focused training in leadership, strategy, innovation, negotiation, communication or digital transformation.
- **Capstone Experience:** This unit may comprise an internship, consultancy experience, research project or international study tour. In addition to growing your business acumen and skill sets, capstone experiences help you develop particular industry knowledge and networks.

Your enrolment process will depend on whether you are entering your course with or without credit:

I'm starting my degree WITHOUT credit

This means that you have no previous Credit for Recognised Learning (CRL) or exemptions from previous study that will be credited into your Master of Commerce. You may have completed a bachelor degree in a non-related field.

What you need to do now:

- ✓ Enrol in the first three business core units + one Discipline unit to begin your studies, listed below.
- ✓ You must select the Pre Major discipline unit in your first 100 credits of study prior to commencing their Major of Choice as noted below
- ✓ Although MGMT6086 Executive Education is part of your second-year study plan, we recommend enrolling in the compulsory masterclasses during your first year. For more details, please check [MCOM Masterclasses webpage](#).

I'm starting my degree WITH credit

If you have a bachelor degree relevant to your chosen major, you may be exempt from studying our commerce core units and be able to complete this course after 1.5 years full-time study.

If you have a relevant bachelor degree, plus five years relevant work experience, you may be able to complete this course after one year.

This means that you have applied for Credit for Recognised Learning (CRL) of exemptions from previous study that will be transfer as credit into your Master of Commerce.

What you need to do now:

- ✔ If you haven't already done so, apply for Credit for Recognised Learning (CRL) immediately with all documentation/qualifications/work experience required.
- ✔ When your CRL is approved, go to eStudent via your OASIS to choose your major and enrol in units.

! Please note: you must apply for CRL as soon as possible, as your application may take some time to process which will delay your ability to enrol in units (some units have limited availability or you might not get your preferred timetable). [Check the CRL website](#) for more details and deadlines.

Depending on which units you are given credit for, you may be exempt from some or all core business units. It's important to read the Curtin Handbook closely and discuss your study plan with the Curtin Enrolments Team to map out the units you are enrolling in.

If you are an Master of Qualifying Programme (MQP) pathway student, you may already have a set study plan provided to you.

You are still invited to all workshops (listed on page 4) as they are still highly valuable sessions to support your knowledge, understanding of your degree and learn about other services and opportunities.



Frequently Asked Questions

What does 'credit' mean? What about 'CRL'?

Credit is how the value of a unit or a degree is calculated. Most units are worth 25 credit points. Credit for Recognised Learning (CRL) gives you an exemption from certain units for study or work you have previously completed. You must apply at study.curtin.edu.au/applying/credit-recognised-learning/apply

Can I change my major in the future?
